She was tired of living in a small, cramped two-bedroom apartment with her children. She was tired of having to share a bed with her son. And most importantly, she was tired of not being able to give her children the home they deserved.

In a brief speech addressed to those who attended the ceremony, Carter thanked God for placing Habitat for Humanity in her life and blessing her kids with a new, beautiful home. Wiping tears from her face, she also thanked all of the volunteers who donated their time to help her make her dreams come true.


